Wuhan Yangtze International School

We are a vibrant international community that provides transformative, holistic Pre K–12 education to develop globally minded individuals who learn, love and lead. As a LifePlus international school, we inspire our students to go and make a life-changing difference for the common good.

School + community

Established in 2003, Wuhan Yangtze International School is an independent, co-educational, tuition-based international school located in Wuhan, China. We provide a Pre–K through Grade 12 education for the expatriate community. We use an American college-preparatory curriculum with English as the main language of instruction.

Curriculum

All high school students are enrolled in a rigorous college-preparatory program. The academic program is organized on an alternating day, rotating-block schedule of 200 minutes per week, per course. Students attend five block classes a day. Full-time students are required to enroll in a minimum of six credits per year.


Graduation + credit requirements

23 high school credits are required for graduation. A minimum of 6 credits is needed for each year. Courses taught daily are valued at 0.5 credit per semester, while courses taught on alternate days are valued at 0.25 credit per semester (equivalent of 45 minutes per day). The following credits must be completed for graduation:

Co-curricular activities

In both our middle and high school divisions for athletics, we offer girls' and boys' competitive volleyball, soccer and basketball.

Students also have the opportunity to participate in band, choir, drama, Student Council, Model United Nations, LifePlus Fine Arts Festival, VEX robotics, science fair and service trips to locations in Asia. We offer Teaching Assistant internships within specific departments at our school for upper high school students.

School calendar

One school year at Wuhan Yangtze has approximately 180 days. The school year is divided into two semesters: the first from August to December and the second from January to June.



Grading + GPA

All academic instruction is in English except for foreign language courses. We use a 4.0 grading scale with skills-based alignment. Only coursework completed at the school is used in the calculation of a student's GPA. All course graders are of equal weight including AP courses. Grades are published every semester using a standard A to F system. Letter grades are entered on a student's transcript at the end of each semester, along with a cumulative GPA. We do not report class rank due to the transient nature of the student body and the diversity of educational backgrounds.




AP® scores
